## **E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures**

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:
  - When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.
  - At the end of every academic year the selected representatives of each institution will review the performance of transfer students to assess their success in the context of the curriculum specified in this agreement, with an eye toward evaluating the appropriateness of that curriculum and the quality of its delivery.
2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:
  - At the end of each academic year the receiving department shall generate a log indicating:
    1. The names and number of students who transfer under the agreement.
    2. The number of credits accumulated by these students, along with GPA data for coursework in the major.

This log will be made available to the departmental Chairperson of both institutions' department for their assessments.

- This articulation agreement will be publicized by the transfer student advisors.
