Steps on Your Path

Research Law Schools

- Investigate which is "Right for You"
- Review websites and visit schools
- Aim high but be realistic
- Apply to a broad range of schools: Out-of-State, Private, Public

Understand the Application Process

Timing:
 GPA:
 Plan Ahead – 18 Active Months
 Includes GPA from ALL schools

LSAT: Long Term Preparation Prep Courses Necessary

• **Personal Statement**: Begin it Now as a Contract with

Yourself

• **Recommendations**: Need 3 Faculty Letters

Next Steps in the Process

- Identify the GPA your Target Law Schools Want
 - » All GPAs are averaged together
- Identify the LSAT Range for Target Schools
 - » LSAT scores are good for 5 years
 - » Identify schools' response to taking several LSATs
- Identify LSAT Exam Dates & When to Take it
 - » June (Junior Year) & October (Senior Year) usually best
- LSAT Study: 3 4 months & 20 30 Hours a Week
- Identify the Best LSAT Prep Course for You
 - » Different target groups for each course





Next Steps (cont'd)

- Register with CAS Early: Fall of Junior Year
- **Calendar your Application Process**
 - Identify time you will need to complete your applications
- Determine How Many Schools to Apply to
 - Identify their Fees
- **Apply for Fee Waiver\$ from LSAC & Law Schools!**
- Rolling Admissions Early Decision?
 - If so, you will have to finish your application before November
 - Remember: Timing Makes a Difference!

Money Should Never Prevent you from Applying to Law School!

- A cost benefit analysis will reveal that you will be able to finance your education
- Fees waivers and reduced-cost LSAT prep courses are available
- The CAS has fee waivers for costs (see PLI) and many schools will use the CAS fee waiver to waive their application fees
- Kaplan and other test-prep programs have tuition assistance programs to provide discounts to low-income students. <u>Ask Early!</u> Timing makes a Difference!
- Most law schools will grant waivers for application fee for documented hardship cases.
 Prepare a standard hardship letter.
- Look for low cost/high quality prep courses—e.g., Nelson Test Prep, PRLDEF
- Keep your GPA High!
 This will help you get into law school and increases your chances of getting a scholarship.

Establish a Timetable Sample Law School Application Timeline

Freshmen & Sophomores

- Choose an Appropriate Major
- Meet with Pre Law Advisor
- Visit LSAC Website
- Apply to Boot Camps & Specialized Prep Programs
- Become Familiar with LSAT Prep Courses
- Take LSAT Practice Tests
- Begin Personal Statement as a Contract with Yourself
- Use Courses and Academic Programs to Develop Analytical, Writing, and Reasoning Skills
- Apply for an Internship or Job Related to your Legal Interests

Juniors

- Register with CAS fall of junior year (Valid 1 year)
- Take LSAT Prep Course
- Begin Studying for October LSAT
- Attend the LSAC Forum,
 October 12 13
- Complete Personal Statement and have it Reviewed
- Request 3 Letters of Recommendation
- Visit Law Schools
- View Law School Applications
- Contact Admissions Offices
- Continue to Focus on your GPA

Seniors

- Take the October LSAT,
 December & February are
 TOO LATE
- Create Applications
 Timeline with School
 Deadlines in Mind
- Finish Applications No Later than Mid-November
- Apply Earlier for "Early Acceptance" Programs
- Research and Apply for Scholarships and Grants
