

# **COUNTERTERRORISM SERIES**

June - July 2014

Throughout the month of June and into July 2014, the Center for Private Security and Safety will offer a series of courses on counterterrorism. To fully comprehend counterterrorism, one must look at existing practices on a global scale. This enables one to think sensibly about counterterrorism and better understand "what works" and "what does not work" within counterterrorism.

This training series explores transnational terrorism, the role of private security in counterterrorism, and the role of the private sector in countering terrorists' use of the Internet. Additionally, it examines and evaluates transportation and embassy security measures designed to deal with terrorism.
